Kittens need a balanced, nutritious

It is important that you have your kitten checked for fleas. Each flea can lay up to 2000 eggs, so a single flea can be a big problem. If your cat will be venturing outside, we recommend treating to prevent flea problems.

Flea treatments can be applied to kittens from six weeks of age, once a month to treat and prevent fleas. You should contact your vet for advice if you are concerned about fleas in a younger kitten.

Kittens are innoculated to protect them against cat flu (feline herpes and calici virus) and enteritis (panleukopenia virus). We recommend the feline leukaemia virus vaccination - particularly for outdoor cats.

Kittens should be vaccinated from

eight weeks old. Please check whether your kitten has had vaccinations prior to you adopting them and bring any vaccination paperwork to your vet appointment.
